Reaching Two Continents Preaching One Christ

Dear Friends of the Ministry,

Our hearts are overflowing with joy at the opportunity to reach out to you by letter after a few long months. Over the past few months, we have been holding the rope and staying faithful to the work that God has placed us in and His Word. I would like to give you a glowing report of many saved, but I am unable to do so.

What I can tell you is that I believe that we are starting to see some growth in a few people who have been saved for some time but have been superficial in their Christian lives. We had a young man from the Ivory Coast in West Africa attend our service and come forward to receive Christ as his Savior. He told me that day that his father was a pastor, but he did not have a close relationship with him. He has attended a few of our services since, and I recently reached out to him, and he informed me that he had been attending with his father. I told him that we would be praying for him and desired to see him grow in the Lord, and we are here for him. Please continue to pray for this young man named David.

We have a few of our young people attending youth camp, and a couple of young ladies will be serving as counselors at the Higher Ground youth camp, hosted by Brother Lamar Whittemore and Harvest Baptist Church in Watertown, SD. Please be in prayer for the camp and our young people that they will grow closer to the Lord during this time. We have also gone door-to-door each month, distributing tracts and John and Romans. However, this month, we are beginning to set up a Bible tent, hoping that people will stop by and get to know us a little better as a church on their own terms. The Lord has provided me with some wonderful contacts for obtaining Bibles and other materials. I hope we can give away bookbags for children starting school in August from the Bible tent. Please help us pray that this is well-received and attended by the church congregation.

In Africa, we have continued working on the facility for the Bible college. We have completed the roof on a portion of the building, and now we plan to finish that part with doors and windows soon. Before classes begin again, we need to install showers and toilets for the students. After this, we can work on the main hall, where the classes will eventually be held. However, in the meantime, we have a small room available for classes. Please pray for this project, as it has faced opposition from local residents. This is not uncommon in Northern Uganda in the Lugbara area, and we have experienced it before.

Please pray that the Lord will give us wisdom in handling these situations and that the necessary funds to complete these projects will be provided. Additionally, our family is

eager to travel to Uganda and visit the work being done there. Would you please pray with us that the Lord would provide the time away from the

work here and the funds needed for travel and the renewal of passports?
