



Proclaiming the Messiah - Preaching the Word - Praying for Israel

Dear Praying Friends and Supporters,

Shalom! I want to take a moment to thank you from the bottom of my heart for your faithful support—both in prayer and giving—that made my most recent trip to Israel and the Middle East possible. This journey was not just another visit; it was a Spirit-led mission filled with divine appointments, prophetic insight, and kingdom-impacting connections.

One of the central highlights was attending the Jerusalem Prayer Breakfast, where leaders from over 60 nations gathered to pray for the peace of Jerusalem (Psalm 122:6), build bridges between Jews and Christians, and stand boldly against anti-Semitism and replacement theology. The unity and conviction in that room were nothing short of powerful. I had the unique honor of carrying the Banner of Judah during the opening procession of the 12 Tribes of Israel. To lift high the banner of the tribe from which Messiah Yeshua (Jesus) came (Hebrews 7:14; Revelation 5:5) was humbling. It was a visual testimony of God's enduring covenant with Israel and of the Lion of the Tribe of Judah, who will soon return.

During this event, I also had the opportunity to meet with former Governor Mike Huckabee, a consistent voice for Israel and biblical values. I was also able to meet with Knesset members and Israeli leaders, gaining insight into the spiritual and political issues shaping Israel's future. It is clear we are living in days spoken of by the prophets (Ezekiel 36–37; Zechariah 12:2–3).

One of the most moving encounters came when I spoke with an ultra-Orthodox rabbi who privately shared his belief in Yeshua. Please continue to pray for him as he walks a difficult path of faith under great pressure. These moments affirm God's promise in Romans 11:26: "And so all Israel shall be saved." I also spent time with Rabbi Yehuda Glick, a leading advocate for religious liberty and Jewish-Christian unity. I reconnected with my Romanian friend and worked together on impactful ministry projects, and I built a new friendship with Chaim Malespin, a key figure in the IDF who shares a passion for restoration and unity.

Another unexpected blessing came through a short visit to Amman, Jordan, where I met up with my dear friend, Tony Wood, a faithful servant working in the region. I was able to personally deliver Bibles and supplies to him—resources urgently needed for the work he's doing. A special thank-you to those who helped provide those Bibles—your support is touching lives far beyond what you can see!

I also had the opportunity to preach at Jerusalem Baptist Church, sharing a message of hope, urgency, and prophecy. With signs of Messiah's return increasing, our mission remains clear: to proclaim the Gospel, reach the lost, and stand with Israel (Luke 21:28; 1 Thessalonians 5:1–6). I even had the opportunity to street preach in both Jerusalem and Tel Aviv—publicly sharing the Good News in these cities. Thanks to your generosity, I was also able to assist individuals and families financially, demonstrating the love of Messiah in both word and deed (James 2:15–16).

Friends, I truly couldn't do this without you. Like Paul, I say with all sincerity: "I thank my God upon every remembrance of you... for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now" (Philippians 1:3–5).
